- In the very unlikely event of a fire or emergency please follow the Shine Dome staff directions and evacuate the building and assembly in the Shine Dome car park, at the bottom of the Staircase.

All National galleries have free entrance. Visitor guides and maps are available at the registration desk. The closest major gallery is the National Museum of Australia, approx. 20 minutes' walk from Shine Dome along the Lake Burley Griffin. Head to the lake from Shine dome and turn right once you reach the pathway along the lake to reach the museum. Instead, if you turn left and walk along the lake, you will reach Commonwealth bridge (~10 mins walk) and the scenic walk/bike 5km path around the central basin of the lake (see





**Dining options:** There are a few restaurants/cafes/bars across the Edinburgh Avenue, attached to the hotels Ovolo Nishi, Peppers Gallery and QT. These include Rebel Rebel, Capitol Bar & Grill, Bicicletta, AK's, High Jinks, Li'l Brew, Parlour, Monster Kitchen & Bar, Mocan & Green Grout etc.



For a much wider range of options, head towards the Canberra city centre. Due to the ongoing construction works in the area, we recommend using Edinburgh Ave -> Marcus Carke St -> Alinga St (or Rudd St) to reach the city centre area (Bunda St/Garema Place/City Walk etc).



**Parking:** Limited parking is available for EMO 2025 attendees. Access the Shine Dome carpark via Gordon Street (*not* Marcus Clarke st), the boom gate is open during 9.30am -4.30pm. If you plan to drive to the venue outside these hours, please contact in advance Hemant Singh (<u>h.singh@unsw.edu.au</u>) for instructions.
